Eighth Day, Monday, July 10, 1916.

Board met pursuant to adjournment, all members present. The entire session was spent in preparing for and participating in the laying of the corner stone of the new court house. The meeting was presided over by Chairman Copeland. The principal address was made by Secretary of Labor W. B. Wilson. After the regular program the corner stone was lowered into its regular position, containing a box with contents as follows: The articles taken from the corner stone of the present courthouse: Sioux City Daily Journal, July 20, 1876. Sioux City Weekly Journal, July 20, 1876; Youth's Bazaar, April, 1876; History of Woodbury County, by George W. Wakefield; by laws of lodges as follows: Landmark lodge No. 272, A. F. and A. M.; Sioux City lodge No. 103, A. F. and A. M.; Columbia lodge No. 13, K. of P.; Western Star lodge No. 282, I. O. O. F.; Sioux City Lodge No. 164, I. O. O. F.; Sioux City Encampment No. 44, I. O. O. F.; Sioux City Courier, July 15, 1876; names of board of supervisors and county officers, impressions of seals used by county; official returns of general election held October 12, 1875, including returns of the vote on the question of issuing bonds for new courthouse; proceedings of board of September, 1375, and of March, 1876; a collection of small coins, both domestic and foreign. Wilson, district court judges, reporters and bailliffs, county officers, present courthouse, tuberculosis hospital, Flks' Club, street scenes in Slowx City and drives about Stone Park; coins: 1-cent, 5-cent, 10-cent, 85-cent, 50-cent places and \$1.

One-cent pieces of 1816, 1857, 1859, 1878 and 1909; one dime of 1878; 5-deal place of 1835; half dime of 1872; 3-cent of 1881; convenir of Paname-California exposition;

On motion, the board adjourned until Tuesday, July 11, 1918, at 9 o'elook.


