"Any employee who is retiring and with a minimum of 15 years of employment with the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office will be paid 28% of his/her accumulated sick leave up to a maximum of \$5,000.00. Any employee who has a minimum of 15 years of employment with the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office and accumulated sick leave of 500 or more hours may elect to have the County place funds equivalent to the cost of his/her personal insurance for a period of one year from the date of retirement into a Health Retirement Account (HRA), in lieu of a cash payout up to \$5,000.00. Should the employee elect family coverage, the employee will be responsible for the difference in cost between the personal, single coverage and the cost of family coverage."
